
LARA - part of the solution



 LARA was formed in 1986 as an umbrella organisation for motor sport as recommended by Professor Martin Elson's Report, Providing for Motor Sport – From Image to Reality



- LARA is the motoring organisations' Land Access and Recreation Association and acts as a national forum for the principal groups in countryside motor sport and recreation.
- LARA does not organise events or act as any sort of governing body, but assists members in a wide range of land access issues: policy and practice.
- Motorsport took the advice offered in the 1986
 Sports Council Report, Providing for Motor sport – From Image to Reality, and created the motoring organisations' Land Access and Recreation Association (LARA).
- For thirty years LARA has acted as a unified voice to national and local government, and promoted responsible motor sport and recreation in these increasingly restrictive times.










































LARA's members condone
