


- 179km² and one of 6 Unitary Authorities in Berkshire
- National Equine Database statistics list a total of 2,228 horses registered to owners living within Wokingham Borough. These horses contribute £12 million per annum to the local economy

# Background Wokingham Borough

- The issues in Wokingham
  - Only 10% of the Rights of Way network is bridleway
  - 13,000 new houses to be built in the next 15 years
  - Riders using Main A roads to access bridleways and create circular rides
  - Some bridleways cross main A and B roads which carry heavy traffic at fast speeds making crossing too difficult for some riders to go out hacking
  - Wokingham Greenways plan may not include use by horse riders


- Business Questionnaier Rider Survey
- Broad spectrum of businesses who are located or have a large client base in the Borough
  - Determine size and type of business, number of employees. If a livery yard, how many stables
  - Gain information about their opinions of the affect the development and its associated increase in traffic will have on their business
  - Agree/disagree statements and questions with 'delete as appropriate' answers



### Results

## 71 Equestrian Businesses participated

100% off Business owners agree that without more bridleways horse owners are likely to choose livery outside the Borough





# Research Rider Survey




- Aimed at all riders and horse owners who live or stable their horses within the Borough
  - Gain details of where they live and where they stable their horses
  - Agree/disagree statements and questions with 'delete as appropriate' answers
  - Use tack shops, local events and visits to livery yards to obtain opinions from sufficient numbers of riders



## Results

271 riders participated 2%\_

100% of riders believe increased traffic from the developments will make riding out from their yard significantly more dangerous


# Research Footpath Survey



- Survey footpaths which could be reclassified as bridleway to improve the network
  - Determine total length and plot width of pathway at various points e.g. every 50m, also including narrowest and widest places, note any potential blocks e.g. height restrictions, bollards etc.
  - Use ROWIP and Council Greenways Plan along with own survey to form a 'wish list' to enhance the network
  - Use Parish maps with details of each ROW number so that all information gathered is correct and easily transferred

# Create Awareness Pamphlet



- Put together pamphlet with information from the research for distribution amongst influential people
  - Include statistics on horse ownership by postcode, information from National Equine Database supplied by the BHS, figures collated in 2010.
  - Simple colour scheme to appeal to Councilors, bold but not too modern or corporate.
  - Hard hitting statements, bold and or italics the most important information
  - Use recent photos taken on local roads outside of rush hour
  - One sheet of paper 3 fold to keep printing cost down
  - Local printing company



#### Horses don't dent, they die, so can people in a car should they hit one!

The British Horse Society estimates 3,000 accidents involving horses happen each year on UK roads



Some motorists are very considerate towards horse riders, some are not. Impatient drivers are often inconsiderate drivers. Increased traffic causes longer waiting times at junctions which can frustrate drivers. Frustrated, impatient drivers are more likely to drive inconsiderately, take risks and potentially have accidents.

To allow equestrianism a future within Wokingham Borough, safe routes must be provided for horse riders.

Time is of the essence, action needs to be taken NOW!

### PLEASE HELP **IMPROVE EQUESTRIAN ACCESS**

Recreational riding of horses in Wokingham Borough is threatened by increased development and the additional traffic the new developments will bring.



In some parishes horse riders are using main A and B roads to access the off road routes that are available to them. Without an increase in safer routes, horse riding in Wokingham Borough will become severely compromised.

#### The Fight to Ride

Wokingham Borough currently has a flourishing Equestrian community. This includes Wokingham Pony Club, Wokingham and Bearwood Riding Club, Hurst Riders Club and Farley Hall Riding Club. It also has a large number of livery yards, many of which offer jobs and apprenticeship placements.

The British Horse Society confirms there are 2,228 horses registered to owners within the Wokingham Borough (excluding race horses).

A survey conducted from September to

December 2014, showed that horse riding and
its associated businesses contribute over
£12 million per annum into the economy of
Wokingham Borough.




The facts and figures show that the large amount of planned new development in the Borough (13,000 houses) will adversely affect the future of equestrianism in Wokingham Borough. This would cause:

- limited diversity of sports available
- the demise of local charities and clubs
- reduced social diversity
- restricted enjoyment of the countryside
- fewer jobs within the rural communities

#### **Facts and Figures**

100% of riders believe increased traffic from the developments will make riding out from their yard significantly more dangerous.

86% of riders anticipate moving out of the Borough to find livery for their horse.



100% of Businesses agree that without more Bridleways horse owners are likely to choose livery outside the Borough.

92% of Business owners anticipate reduced business opportunity.



If 86% of the 2,228 riders move their horses out of the Borough, the economic input into the local economy will fall by an estimated £10.5 million.

#### Solutions

In Wokingham Borough, Bridleways make up only 10% of the rights of way. To meet with the expectations of the Rights Of Way Improvement Plan (ROWIP) this needs to significantly increase. ROWIP states that even the national average of 22% is not enough. The Wokingham Greenways plan can help, but no guarantees have been made that horse riders will be included in this scheme.



Riders in Wokingham Borough
desperately need your help and support
to save their community

- In key areas, some footpaths could be upgraded to Bridleway classification to provide some much needed immediate improvements.
- Creating links between existing Bridleways will help horse riders avoid the main roads.
- It is essential that Bridleways are also incorporated into development plans especially in the more rural areas of the Borough e.g. Arborfield and Finchampstead.

Bridleways and Byways will not only provide for horse riders but also for walkers and cyclists and thus make provision for ALL recreational users.




## Access March

## Wokingham Town Centre

- Obtain permission from Council and Police
  - It is essential that only positive press is gained from this!
  - Peaceful not protest!
  - Planed route with minimal time spent on main roads
  - Press release ahead of the day
  - Known horses/riders, competent and safe/quiet
  - Riders and helpers representing every Parish/local equestrian organisation
  - Stewards on each main entrance to the Town
  - Safety card, First Aiders, Vets, Risk Assessment, and Insurance
