The 2026 Challenge

In 2026, unrecorded rights of way that existed before 1949 will be extinguished.

The Challenge is to apply for all the unrecorded or under-recorded rights to be added to the definitive map, before it is too late.



Exemption from Cut Off?

"After the deadline has been reached, any footpath or bridleway created before 1949 which is not recorded on a definitive map and for which no claim has been submitted will, with certain exceptions, be extinguished."

Dispel the myths

- Not all ways are lost
 - many are in current use
- We are not talking about new routes
 - rights already exist but are currently un-recorded
- Many are hedged and ditched lanes

The Sport England Project

- From June 2012 June 2013, Sport England (via the British Equestrian Federation) funded a BHS project to look at how to speed up path recording.
- Hertfordshire and Somerset were the two pilot counties
- We were charged with submitting 50 DMMO applications each, and doing some training
- This talk draws on some of our findings




Unrecorded Rights

- The simple truth is that there are literally hundreds of unrecorded public rights of way in most counties.
- We think there could be hundreds in every county, with dozens in unitary authorities.
- You might be walking or riding an unrecorded right of way next weekend!
- How many unrecorded ways are in your county?



Cornwall






- 1,376 square miles
- 7 former districts
- 213 parishes
- Estimated 5000 unrecorded ways (=2/day for 10 years)
- Many are ORPAs and short joining links

Systematic Research: A-B-C

A. Build a List of Routes

B. Build the Research Library

C. Make DMMO Applications



Building your index

- Mark up your search map with any routes you will investigate
- Number them
- That's it!

 Then use the reference number for filing and tracking at all times

- 528 small grid squares
- One at a time
- Start with Inland
 Revenue Valuation
 Maps (c.1910)
- Then tithes (not grid)
- Then inclosures (not grid)






