## **Site description:**

Situated adjacent to an area of ancient parkland, this site comprises a disused stone quarry with a rich limestone flora, including purple milk-vetch *Astragalus danicus*, clustered bellflower *Campanula glomerata*, wild marjoram *Origanum vulgare*, quaking-grass *Briza media*, autumn gentian *Gentianella amarella* and wild thyme *Thymus polytrichus*. It is the most northerly outpost for early gentian *Gentianella anglica*, with two to three colonies totalling several hundred plants in the old oolitic limestone quarry.

**Qualifying habitats:** The site is designated under **article 4(4)** of the Directive (92/43/EEC) as it hosts the following habitats listed in Annex I:

• Semi-natural dry grasslands and scrubland facies: on calcareous substrates (*Festuco-Brometalia*). (Dry grasslands and scrublands on chalk or limestone)

Qualifying species: The site is designated under article 4(4) of the Directive (92/43/EEC) as it hosts the following species listed in Annex II:

• Early gentian Gentianella anglica
