Cycle Network and off road links to local attractions such as The National Forest Cycle Centre, Conkers and the National Forest Youth Hostel. The P4C funding was for £50,110 for surfacing, gates, drainage and signage. This attracted £15,000 match funding from the private company **Lex Autolease**.

The project will encourage greater outdoor activity and enjoyment of the area by local people. It will make a strong contribution to the regeneration of an old industrial site that has been forested and turned into a valuable recreation area for both locals and visitors to the area.
