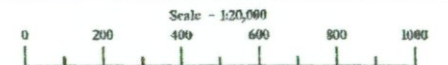

65 & 66-97, 87 & 88-97**

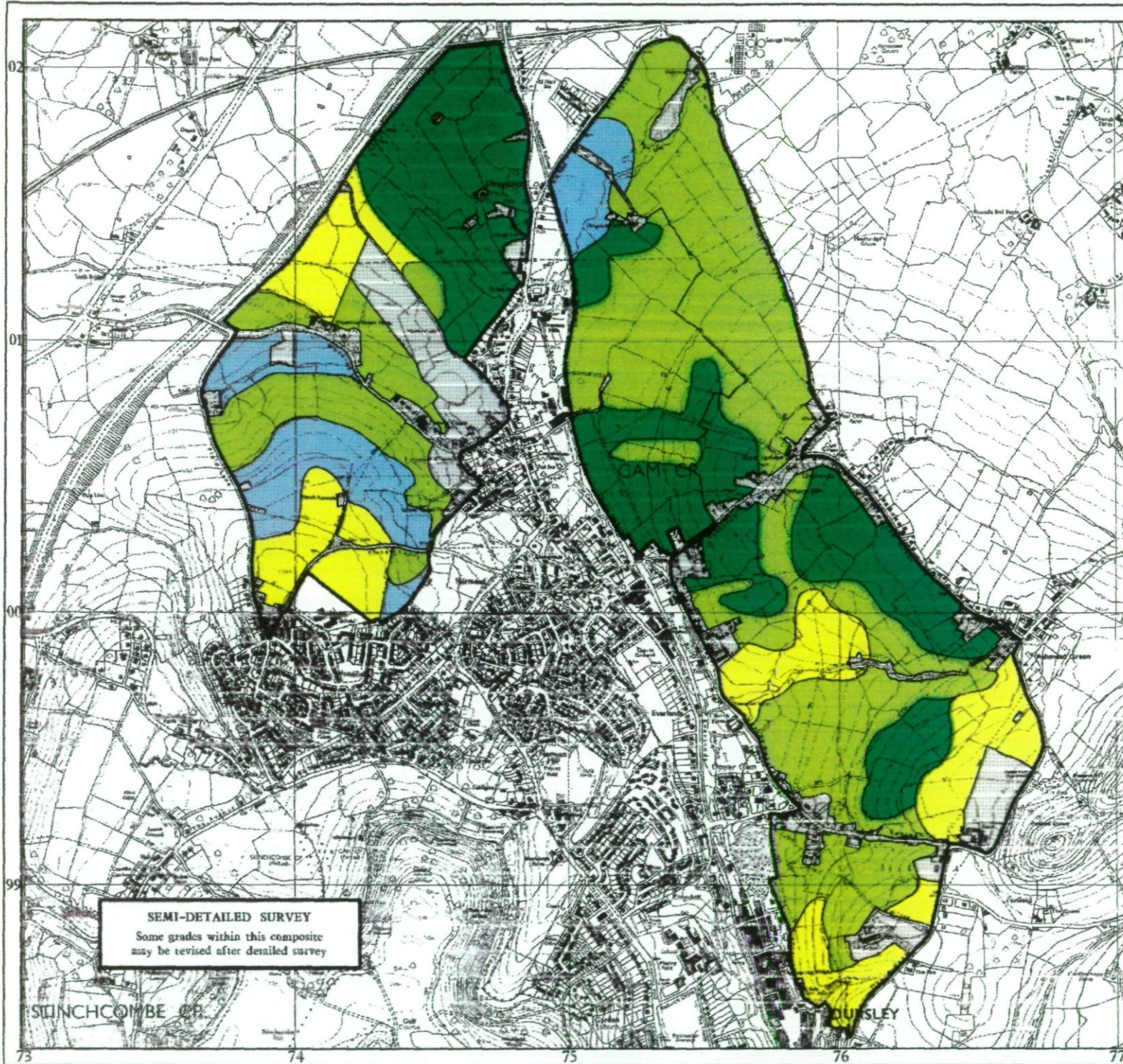
