This new all-weather bridleway links to the Colliers Way which is part of the National Cycle Network (NCN 24). As horse riders are permitted on this part of the Sustrans network, it will enable horse riders, cyclists and walkers to explore the bridleway which passes over the old railway bridge above NCN24, linking eventually to the Ammerdown Estate and the wider rights of way network.
