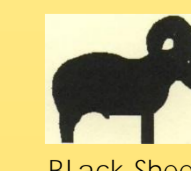
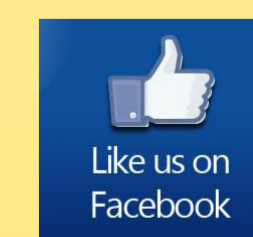
Oases for wildlife – a necklace of dewponds across the Downs



- ✓ Continuous grassland/scrub corridor from east to west.
- ✓ Route from Fyfield Down NNR to Barbury Castle LNR without setting foot on intensively managed land
- ✓ Seven new Wildlife Sites
- ✓ More owls and raptors
- ✓ 47 miles of improved access on Public Rights of Way
- ✓ 8½ miles of permissive access for disabled carriage drivers
- ✓ 115 events attended by over 4,300 people
- ✓ 11 ponds created and 5 restored (one dating from Mediaeval times)
- ✓ Area of land with a reliable water source increased by 38% to 86% of NIA
- ✓ And so much more!
