

Scarborough to Flamborough_Phase 1 Habitat Coastal Survey Target Notes

T1 – Unimproved neutral grassland on cliff side interspersed with bare areas, typical of habitat along majority of the cliff face.

T2 – Gorse scrub and meadow sweet growth on cliff side.

T3 – Running water recorded crossing over the path and trickling down cliff face with meadow sweet growth along the line of a flush/spring on cliff side.

T4 – Species rich unimproved neutral grassland area in cliff side gulley.

T5 – Pond P1 is a small pond surrounded by tall ruderal vegetation and very overgrown with creeping bent and non-native New Zealand pygmyweed also present

T6 – Pond P2 is located in cattle-grazed pasture. Three sides of the pond have poached, bare sides. Lily pads and dense pond weed recorded throughout.

T7 – Recent landslip onto the beach.

T8 – Species rich grassland at gulley bottom.

T9 – A line of dense meadow sweet growing along the cliff ridge next to the footpath to the south of Filey Sands with a small area of bracken and *Phragmites australis* adjacent.

T10 – Meadow sweet growth amongst blackthorn scrub and bracken on cliff side. Isolated gorse growth also recorded toward base of cliff.

T11 – Pond P3 within ‘The Bay’ holiday village. Pond surrounded by tall ruderal vegetation with a small area of amenity grassland to the west.

T12 – Open ended great crested newt/amphibian fencing along south west side of ‘The Bay’ holiday village beach access road.

T13 – Recent landslip on cliff face leaving bare clay soil bund.

T14 – Sand/shingle cliff face with unimproved neutral grassland bordering.
