## Appendix 6. England & Wales Wildfire Forum and wildfire response planning

#### **England & Wales Wildfire Forum (EWWF)**

The forum is a voluntary strategic body, independent of government, created to expand knowledge and understand of wildfire, with the overall purpose of reducing the harmful impact of wildfires by promoting joint working and collaboration.

The EWWF is currently managed by a chair, vice-chair and secretariat:

- Chair: Simon Thorp
- Vice-chair: Dewi Rose, assistant chief fire officer at South Wales Fire and Rescue Service
- Secretary: Robert Stacey, wildfire project officer at Northumberland Fire and Rescue Service.

The EWWF is governed according to the following key principles:

#### Legal status

The forum will hold no legal status. Members agree to work together to deliver the forum's aims and address wildfire issues.

#### Chair

The forum will be chaired by a senior officer of a member organisation. The role of chairperson shall be reviewed annually.

#### Vice chair

The vice chairperson of the forum shall be a senior officer of a member organisation and shall deputise for the chair as required. The role of vice chairperson shall be reviewed annually.

#### Membership

Member organisations shall nominate a standing representative but may if necessary send a replacement representative to forum meetings. New members, either by invitation or on application, shall be admitted at the discretion of the existing forum members. Additional representatives from member organisations shall be co-opted at the discretion of the forum members.

#### Meetings

Forum meetings will be held at least annually, as agreed with members. Additional meetings to address specific matters may be held when necessary. An invitation to attend to discuss specific items of business may be extended to other organisations and individuals. Forum members will host meetings of the forum as appropriate.

#### Work groups

Work groups will be established to undertake tasks of a specific nature as identified by the forum. Membership of work groups will comprise of representatives with expertise or interest in the identified task(s) who shall nominate a group leader. Work groups will report back to the wider forum membership.

#### Administration

The administration function associated with the work of the forum will be undertaken by the chairperson (and/or vice chairman) and an appointed secretariat.

#### **Budget**

Membership of the forum is on a voluntary basis, but member organisations are asked to make a small annual contribution to the running costs of the forum. Any additional funding requirements identified will be progressed through partnership arrangements amongst forum members and other bodies as appropriate.

#### Voting

Every effort will be made to reach decisions by consensus but where a vote is required, the quorum will be six. Each forum member organisation will have one vote and decisions will be taken on the basis of a simple majority.

For the avoidance of doubt, decisions taken by the forum will not be binding upon forum members, albeit members will be expected to support the forum's deliberations in accordance with their commitment. Where it is necessary to take a vote in-between meetings, a vote can be taken by electronic means.

#### Reporting

The forum will produce reports for public circulation as appropriate, related to progress matters relevant to its remit.

#### Relationship with other groups

The forum will establish and maintain close working links with the CFOA Wildfire Group and the Scottish Wildfire Forum. In addition, the forum will promote new and existing relationships with other groups and forums operating in the wildfire arena.

#### Recognition

The forum members agree that in conducting the forum and in publicising its work, full recognition will be given to the support of each member.

#### Withdrawal from the forum

Any member will be entitled to withdraw from the forum after giving written notice to the chairperson (or vice chairperson).

#### **Review**

The forum will review progress on delivery of its aims and objectives on a regular basis.

Members of the EWWF represent a number of key groups and organisations.

The EWWF is open to new members and people are encouraged to contact the secretary should they wish to become more involved with the Forum.

The EWWF holds meetings at least two times per year to discuss wildfire issues of national importance. All members are invited to attend, provide briefings and contribute agenda items for discussion.

The forum also invites non-members to attend meetings to deliver presentations and participate in specific discussions. If you would like to attend a future meeting of the EWWF, please contact the secretary. Dates of meetings can be found on the Forum webpage.

The EWWF aims to produce a number of newsletters each year to help inform the UK wildfire community about key wildfire activities and events. It is intended that that these newsletters will

encourage the sharing of information from those involved in wildfire planning or responses, to share information about experiences, events and projects.

### Wildfire Research and its Impact on Policy, Planning and Operations: the Swinley Forest Fire - 10th April 2015

The EWWF supported a one day seminar held at the University of Greenwich, London which was organised by the University of Greenwich, Bracknell Forest Council, the Knowledge for Wildfire Project, University of Manchester, Forestry Commission England, the Fire Efficient Project and Royal Berkshire Fire and Rescue Service. The event presented examples of wildfire research projects that have been completed since the Swinley Forest Fire in 2011. The event also facilitated discussions between a range of stakeholders on how research can and should impact wildfire policy, planning and operations in the UK.
