- 3 successful by 2012

DHLW – Success/Problems



- Volunteers provided with additional skills and enjoyed research
- Rights of Way added to Definitive Map
- Difficult for HCAF DHLW sub-group to manage and support volunteers
- Need for more professional management

Post DHLW



- HCAF decided to expand project and apply to HLF for funding
- HCC supports bid
- Bid submitted following detailed feedback from HLF on pre-application
- More focus on education and heritage
- HLF awarded HCAF £46,600
- Appointment of Project Manager Stephen Fisher HWTMA


